

Meet Guest Editors

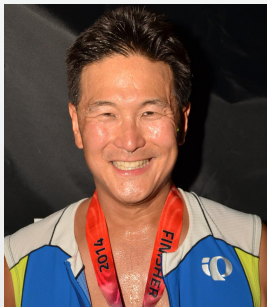
Prof. Martin Miner M.D., is co-Director of the Men's Health Center at the Miriam Hospital in Providence, Rhode Island, USA, and together with Dr. Mark Sigman, Chief of Urology at Brown University, founded the first multispecialty men's health center in the US, combining urological, medical, cardiopreventative, and psychological services. Dr. Miner was trained in Family Medicine and practiced primary care medicine for over 23 years, and then began training in Andrology over a 5 year period. He has published over 30 original publications; 60 additional peer-reviewed publications; 15 book chapters. His interests and areas of research include: erectile dysfunction, testosterone and cardiovascular risk, sexual dysfunctions, BPH, fellowship training and curriculum development in men's health and so on.



Dr. Miner holds appointments in both Urology and Medicine, as an associate professor of family medicine and urology at the Warren Alpert School of Medicine and has served as a member of the Board of Directors of the Sexual Medicine Society of North America and he is the incoming President of the American Society of Men's Health. He is on multiple journal boards and has won numerous awards including the Massachusetts Society of Men's Health Award for the most distinguished service in Men's Health and Brown University Teaching Awards of Excellence in 2003 and 2007. Dr. Miner has given multiple plenary presentations at the American Urology Association and he is a member of the AUA's Sexual Medicine Guideline development.

Prof. Edward D Kim MD, FACS, is Professor of Surgery/Urology at the University of Tennessee Graduate School of Medicine in Knoxville, TN, USA. He received his B.S. and M.D. in the Honors Program in Medical Education at Northwestern University in Chicago, IL. He completed his residency in Urology at Northwestern University in 1995. Dr. Kim then completed a clinical fellowship in Male Reproductive Medicine and Surgery at the Scott Department of Urology, Baylor College of Medicine, in Houston, TX. He has been an American Foundation of Urologic Disease (AFUD) fellow.

Dr. Kim is a former President of the Society for Male Reproduction and Urology (SMRU). He is the current President of the Society for Study of Male Reproduction (SSMR). He has served on the Board of Directors of the American Society of Reproductive Medicine (ASRM). He is the Chief Editor of E-medicine Urology and has served on the editorial boards of Fertility and Sterility, Journal of Andrology and Advances in Urology. He has authored over 110 peer-reviewed articles and book chapters. Clinical interests include the treatment of hypogonadism in men of reproductive age, male infertility and hypogonadism. Dr. Kim avoids the sedentary lifestyle and completed the 2014 Ironman in Louisville, KY.
